OKLAHOMA MOMS DEMAND ACTION CHAPTER SCORES VICTORY AT STATE LEGISLATURE

Letter and email campaign from Moms Demand Action prevented House Bill 2329 from being added to Senate Agenda

(Oklahoma City, OK) April 4, 2014 – The Oklahoma chapter of Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America launched an all-out social media campaign that included parents and school administrators from all over the state encouraging state legislators to put the safety of students in Oklahoma schools above the interests of the gun lobby. In response, Senator Don Barrington, chair of the Public Safety and Homeland Security Committee stated, "due to receiving many letters from concerned parents and school administrators from across the state, HB 2329 by Senator Larry Boggs will not be on the [Senate] agenda."

"Moms put the safety of our children first and we'll do our part to support legislators who do the same," said Moms Demand Action Oklahoma chapter leader, Sabine Brown, "This legislation was bad for our kids and I'm thrilled that our hard work paid off."

HB 2329, introduced by Representative Sally Kern in the House, sought to reduce punishment for bringing a hidden, loaded gun inside a school from a felony to a misdemeanor. Moms Demand Action urged their supporters to email and call their State Senators encouraging them "to protect children's safety over gun lobby interests."
